### Spring Break Storytelling Extravaganza at The Wren's Nest April 7<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup>, 12pm

**ATLANTA – March 26, 2009** – The Wren's Nest house museum is happy to announce special spring break programming throughout the week of April 7<sup>th</sup> through 10<sup>th</sup>. For these four days, The Wren's Nest will offer storytelling each day at noon. Entrance fees will be buy-one-get-one-free (of equal or lesser value) and will include storytelling and a tour. Picnicking on the Wren's Nest's beautiful grounds is encouraged!

The Wren's Nest Ramblers, professional storytellers from the Atlanta area, will perform each day for thirty minutes beginning at noon. The Ramblers will perform Brer Rabbit and Uncle Remus stories in the museum's lovely storytelling garden, weather permitting. Should the weather not permit, storytelling will be held inside the museum.

To receive the special discount rate, which includes the storytelling performance and a tour of the museum, **visitors must arrive before 12pm.** Storytelling will begin promptly at noon to be followed with a tour of the historic museum, led by docents. Tours usually last about 45 minutes.

Visitors are welcome to while away the afternoon in The Wren's Nest beautiful 2.25-acre amphitheatre after storytelling and tours. The built-in stage is perfect for singing garbled lyrics, and our picnic tables and outdoor toys are all available for use.

This is our first time offering this family-oriented spring break opportunity - please come by and take advantage!

The Wren's Nest is Atlanta's oldest house museum and the home of Joel Chandler Harris, author of the Brer Rabbit and Uncle Remus tales. Since its opening as a museum in 1913, the Wren's Nest has become a cultural institution in Atlanta.

Located in historic West End, the Wren's Nest is open to the public Tues through Sat, 10 am – 2:30 pm. Storytellers work their magic on Saturdays at 1pm, or by appointment. Tours are given on a first-come, first-serve basis.
