### AJC Decatur Book Festival and Wren's Nest Publishing Co. Enters its Third Year

**ATLANTA – April 3, 2009** – The Wren's Nest house museum is happy to announce that for the third consecutive year, we will be offering an outstanding and unique publishing opportunity for Atlanta-area teenagers.

The Wren's Nest is working in conjunction with the AJC Decatur Book Festival to once again put together a publication that will be student-written, student-edited and student-published. The resulting literary journal will be released and promoted by the Decatur Book Festival (DBF) over Labor Day weekend.

Eight to ten students in the Atlanta area will have the opportunity to join the program as editors and learn about publishing first-hand from Atlanta-area professionals. The program is entirely free to participants. In previous years, students toured Paste Magazine, the AJC, and worked directly with local writers. We look forward to the same competition for these positions as years past.

Students also have the opportunity to submit pieces to be included in the publication. The literary journal will accept short stories, artwork, poetry, and essays. Anything under 10 pages has a fighting chance. Final decisions will be made by the student editors.

In 2007 The Wren's Nest Publishing Co. released *Soy Nut Butter: Nutritious, Delicious, Fictitious*, followed by *Vernacular* in 2008. The proceeds from both journals went directly into funding the program.
